Tomi Reichental was born in 1935 in Piestany, Slovakia. In 1944 he was captured and deported to Bergen-Belsen concentration camp together with his mother, grandmother, brother, aunt and cousin. When he was liberated in April 1945, he discovered that 35 members of his extended family were killed in the Holocaust.

Tomi has lived in Dublin since 1959, and he is one of the very few Holocaust survivors currently residing in Ireland. Tomi's story inspired several documentaries including '*I Was a Boy in Belsen*', '*Close to Evil*', '*Till the Tenth Generation*', '*Condemned to Remember*'.
